Taking care of oral health is crucial for our overall physical well being and it is very important to see a dental care professional regularly. As of December 1 2022 Govt of Canada is accepting applications for the new interim Canada Dental Benefit for children who are under 12 years of age as of 1 December 2022, have a net family income of less than \$90,000 and do not have access to private and dental insurance.

We welcome Ann Maries and wish her all the best in her new role!









To accommodate as many individuals as possible, two sessions were organized and one hundred twenty individuals were motivated to Rekindle the Spark.





LIGHTING OF THE GREEN





RECIPE BY KAREN BOWEN ASSESSOR, DSO



INGREDIENTS

- 1.5 cups softened butter
- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 cup icing sugar
- 1 cup cornstarch

METHOD

- · Combine all ingredients in a glass mixing bowl
- Shape the dough into 1" balls, Flatten each ball with a fork or use cookie cutters. Decorate as you wish!
- Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet at 300 F for 20 minutes until the bottoms are very lightly browned
- Transfer to a paper towel-covered wire rack to cool
- Enjoy and share with friends and family

TIPS & TRICKS

- Never use metal bowls or utensils
- If it's dry, add a bit more butter until the dough starts to stick together
- The dough shouldn't be too sticky, just enough so that you can roll it into balls without it crumbling apart
