

The Elmira Maple Syrup Festival is a volunteer-organized and executed not-for-profit organization that returns all proceeds to community groups. Over the past 58 years, the festival has donated over \$1,000,000 to local not-for-profit and charity organizations across the Waterloo Region.

Several of Sunbeam's staff and volunteers volunteered at the Elmira Maple Syrup Festival to help cook and serve the festival's iconic pancake breakfast. It was an excellent opportunity for Sunbeam to give back to the community.


