CHILDREN'S PSYCHIATRY CLINIC

THE LYNDHURST HOME

Sunbeam is relocating individuals from the Parkview Group Home to a more suitable setting, The Lyndhurst Home in Kitchener's Stanley Park community. The decision to move was based on the evolving support needs of the residents. Sunbeam carefully researched the ideal features for a home serving individuals requiring behavioural assistance and consulted with Parkview residents and staff to create a list of essential features.

In fall 2021, Sunbeam found a property that could be modified to meet their criteria. The Lyndhurst Home will feature an addition to provide separate living spaces for four individuals, ensuring common areas and individual bedrooms. The neighbourhood offers convenient amenities, including a walkway, proximity to the expressway, a schoolyard with basketball nets, and a nearby mall. The home is also close to Sunbeam's Kingsway Campus with a therapy pool and gym, as well as Fairview Park Mall.

The renovation work is on schedule for completion by the end of 2023, with clients looking forward to their move-in date.



INSPIRE ACCESSABILITY SHOWCASE

On October 28th, 2023 Developmental Services Ontario Central West Region (DSO) attended the Inspire AccessAbility Showcase at M.M. Robinson High School in Burlington, Ontario. SANDI MILES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP


The Sandi Miles Memorial Scholarship was founded and first awarded in 2000, as a result of the generous creation of a memorial scholarship fund by her family. Sandi Miles was the Associate Director of Sunbeam for over 10 years. Sunbeam's Board of Directors eventually assumed responsibility for the scholarship program, changing the name to "The Sunbeam Board of Directors Sandi Miles Memorial Scholarship."

The primary purpose of the scholarship is to support post-secondary education in the field of Human Services. This year the scholarship program is providing two awards of \$2,500 to dependents of Sunbeam staff who meet the eligibility criteria.

At the September Sunbeam Board of Directors meeting, the 24th Annual Sandi Miles Memorial Scholarship was presented to recipients Chloe Burke and Serena Otto. The award was presented by Board President Ann Marie Yantz with the Board of Directors and special guest Sandy Roxborough (the daughter of Sandi Miles and a former Director on the Sunbeam Board).

The recipients expressed their deep gratitude for the support of Sunbeam and the Board of Directors.
