Dedicated to socialization time and conversation starters fostered meaningful connections, with many attendees exchanging contact information. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with participants expressing appreciation for the supportive environment and suggesting more regular events.

Valuable resources were shared, and follow-up emails helped attendees stay connected and informed about housing options. This successful event highlighted the importance of community in finding compatible housemates, sparking plans for future gatherings.

The Sunbeam Developmental Resource Centre hosts the Transitional-Aged Youth (TAY) Coordination program, supporting youth aged 16-22 years in the Central West Region who have transitioned out of provincial child protection services. Host Family Homes is one program option, with individuals living in the community in a supportive family environment.

Mary has been supported by Sunbeam's Host Family Home program since age 18. Mary was welcomed to her new home earlier this year in a close-knit farming community near Belleville. She works part-time as an assistant educator at a preschool, volunteers weekly at a health hub, and enjoys local activities like collecting eggs, skating, and playing ball hockey. Mary tells us she is thriving in her new home and community, recently celebrating her 28th birthday. Mary feels a great sense of belonging as a valued and active member of her community - and is proud of the person she's grown to be. We are so happy for you, Mary!











Snoezelen Room Transformation

Sunbeam's Holiday Appeal for 2024 is in support of transforming and modernizing our Snoezelen Room at Sunbeam's Kingsway Campus in Kitchener.

A Snoezelen Room is a multi-sensory environment that promotes comfort and relaxation, helping to reduce agitation and anxiety while also engaging and delighting users by stimulating visual, audio and tactile (sight, sound and feel) responses and encouraging verbal and non-verbal communication.


A Snoezelen multi-sensory space is beneficial and meaningful to children, youth, adults and older adults, and can be experienced alone, or more often as a shared experience with a family member, other caregivers, support staff or therapist. Through thoughtful, evidence-based design, the new space will nurture therapeutic and emotional needs while also ensuring accessibility, safety and comfort.
