We are so pleased to share that Sunbeam's Holiday Appeal for 2024 is in support of the complete redesign and transformation of our Snoezelen Room at Sunbeam's Kingsway Campus in Kitchener. **Snoezelen**: The word Snoezelen originates from the Dutch words for Snufflen (to seek out) and Doezelen (to relax).

The Snoezelen Room promotes a multi-sensory environment that helps reduce agitation and anxiety by stimulating visual, audio and tactile responses and encouraging verbal and non-verbal communication.

DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES

Used by healthcare professionals for decades, a properly designed Snoezelen multi-sensory space, tailored to the diverse needs of persons living with **developmental disabilities** promotes relaxation and calm using gentle light, interesting visuals and varied textures. In addition to balancing sensory stimulation, the Snoezelen Room provides learning and development opportunities such as colour matching, understanding cause and effect and creating themed environments.

Multi-sensory environment: Used increasingly for education, therapy, stimulation, calming, interaction, treatment, in a safe and comfortable atmosphere with an air of enjoyment and motivation. Fosters improvements to client/caregiver relationship, and designed to enhanced quality of life.

Neurodivergent individuals, whether living with a developmental disability, **ADHD**, on the **autism** spectrum, or experiencing other complex needs usually have challenges with over- or under-stimulation. Often unable to organize and respond appropriately to uncontrolled stimuli, a properly designed Snoezelen space can provide a controlled and calming multi-sensory experience, or a single sensory focus depending on the individual's needs.

Beneficial and meaningful to children, youth and adults, regardless of ability, Snoezelen can be experienced alone, or as a shared experience with a family member, another caregiver, support staff or therapist. **Developmental disabilities**: A group of conditions due to an impairment in physical, learning, language, or behaviour areas. These conditions begin during the child's developmental period, may impact day-to-day functioning, and usually last throughout a person's lifetime

The Sunbeam Community has consistently benefited from having a tailored multi-sensory space as part of our onsite therapeutic amenities. Currently, we are undergoing a much-needed complete transformation of our Snoezelen Room at Sunbeam's Kingsway Campus.

Neurodivergent: An umbrella term for individuals whose brains process information differently than most people. It's used to describe people with conditions like Autism Spectrum Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Tourette's syndrome and Tics.

This new design incorporates state-of-the-art multi-sensory equipment (such as bubble tubes, fibre optics, 360° projection systems) as well as comfort and interactive amenities (custom surfaces, interactive panels, tactile interfaces with texture and motion). We are also committed to ensuring a fully accessible space, including main floor access, a ceiling lift, automated door openers and close proximity to accessible washroom facilities.

Whether supported through a Sunbeam inclusive living group home or living in the community at large, many individuals will greatly benefit from having access to the Snoezelen Room.

ADHD: Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) is a behavioural disorder characterized by symptoms of inattention and/or impulsivity and hyperactivity

Due to the specialized design and functionality of the equipment, interactive amenities and accessibility features needed to develop this new Snoezelen multi-sensory space, the budget for this project is \$75,000.

This one-time investment, made possible through the kind generosity of Sunbeam supporters like you, will enable a stateof-the-art therapeutic multi-sensory space and experience.



Autism: Autism Spectrum Disorder is a lifelong developmental disability that affects how a person communicates with, and relates to, other people and the world around them. People with autism may also experience over- or under-sensitivity to sounds, touch, tastes, smells, light or colours.
