This funding will help Sunbeam's Brightside ABA Services expand and enhance core clinical autism services, including applied behaviour analysis (ABA), speech-language pathology, occupational therapy, and mental health supports, for children and youth acros s the Waterloo Region, ensuring families receive timely, high-quality care through an interdisciplinary model.
