Creating Home- A Gathering of Families and Possibilities



This fall, Developmental Services Ontario- Central West Region hosted **Creating Home- A Gathering of Families and Possibilities** in Milton, bringing together 19 families and individuals to explore future housing options for their loved ones. The day began with a warm icebreaker focused on what makes a welcoming home, setting the tone for connection and collaboration.

A brief DSO presentation showcased real-life housing solutions, community partners, and planning tools. Participants then joined small-group discussions to reflect on housing goals, timelines, and support needs. Families shared challenges—like securing 24-hour care and navigating legislation—and successes using tools such as Microboards, Registered Disability Savings Plans, and community networks.

The event ended with a strong sense of hope and belonging, as families found encouragement and inspiration in each other's journeys toward inclusive futures.


"The Hospital Care Program is a life-saving service. This Program gives families peace of mind and ensures loved ones, like Shawn, receive the care and dignity they deserve."


