Sunbeam is the designated **Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC) Champion Co-Lead for Waterloo Region**, providing information, resources, supports and expertise to all local organizations funded by the Ministry of Children, Community & Social Services (MCCSS). We could not do this alone, relying on collaboration and trusted partnerships with Region of Waterloo Public Health, Ontario Health, local Ontario Health Teams, the Provincial Network on Developmental Services and our many Developmental Services partner organizations across Ontario.

The COVID-19 vaccination pop-up clinics hosted by Sunbeam in 2021 were a “made in Waterloo Region” initiative that helped accelerate the availability of vaccinations to the people we serve. Our brand new, state-of-the-art Specialized Dental Clinic was developed, we celebrated Sunbeam's 65th Anniversary of Service and strategic growth continued by expanding Sunbeam's service capacity. In the past year alone, we launched the Sunbeam Kids Hub program, the Roseville Group Home, two specialized group living programs in Cambridge, and continued to expand our group living programs across Waterloo Region.

I would also like to acknowledge the visionary governance provided by Sunbeam's Board of Directors. We will soon be saying farewell to three long-serving board members as their terms come to an end – our President, Ben Spengen (7 years), Secretary and Governance Chair, Mark Schneider (9 years) and Treasurer and Finance Chair, Dave Otto (30 years), and welcoming a number of new community volunteers to the Board of Directors. 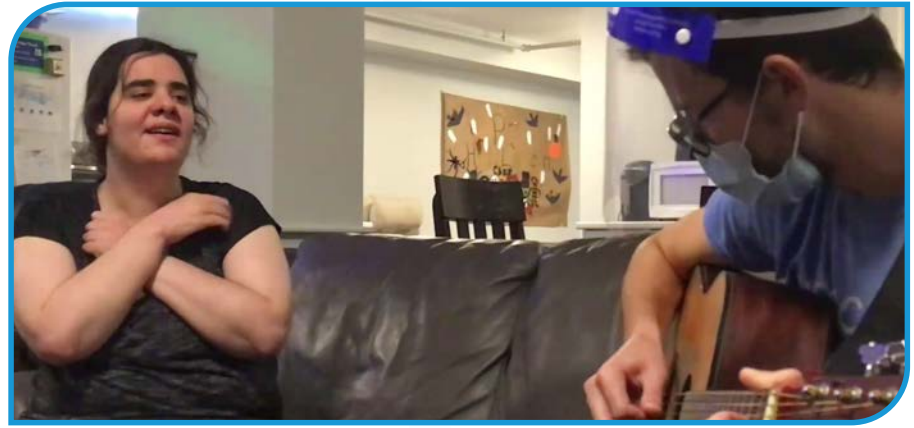


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Message from the Board President

Sunbeam's 65th Anniversary

Sunbeam's Origin Story

The founders of Sunbeam, Pieter and Johanna Vos, were born in the Netherlands, where they grew up under Nazi occupation. Johanna was a nurse. Pieter was a missionary. They came to Canada, where they were heavily involved in the Salvation Army and made connections with the Mennonite community in the Waterloo Region area.

Pieter and Johanna purchased their first home at 552 Frederick Street, where Sunbeam began in 1956. Pieter and Johanna converted the garage into a nursery where they would eventually care for 20 children. The family moved to 4 Willow Street, where the Vos' children began to take a much more active role in the organization, as the number of children in care continued to grow.

They continued to expand and purchase new properties, to allow them to care for close to 300 children. In the 1970s, under the tutelage of Dr. Koegler, new programs, such as physio and recreation were added, along with dental clinics, and a family research center.

Though Pieter passed away in 1997, and Johanna passed away in 2001, their legacy lives on at Sunbeam.

I am 23, have blue eyes, and I am tall. I had lived in a lot of group homes before and moved to my home at

Sunbeam last year. At first, I was anxious about living in my new home and having new staff. After I got use to everyone and my home, I have started to do more things. I like where I am living. It is like being in the country. I like seeing the squirrels, and bunnies, and even saw a coyote and a fox. I like the trains going by too. I like walking in the back yard to the river. I like fishing too.

I am learning to bake muffins, and I am starting to do my dishes after my meals. I vacuum the living room rug and wipe down light switches and door handles as well.

I like watching hockey on the television with staff and watching videos on my Tablet. I want to try riding my bike again when it is warmer. I am swimming two times a week at the Sunbeam pool. I enjoy going for long walks on trails and in parks in the area with staff. I have fishing poles, and I am going to get my fishing license. I will be helping staff pick up groceries and will help sort them and put them away. When I am upset, I can call the Manager even at night. This helps me when I don't know how to say how I am feeling to the staff sometimes.

Jacob's father shared that Jacob has changed over the year he has spent at Sunbeam. He is able to express himself and share how he is feeling to his father and his mother which he was not previously able to do successfully. Before his move, Jacob could not be in a car for more than 10 minutes and now likes car rides. Jacob's father has observed that the staff know Jacob, what he likes and does not like and how to speak with him. He stated Jacob seems happier - their weekly family visits are positive and after a few years of not being able to, they had their first overnight visit, which was very positive. The team approach to Jacob's care is valued - Jacob's father appreciates how the manager and staff work collaboratively to ensure Jacob has the best care and support provided to him.

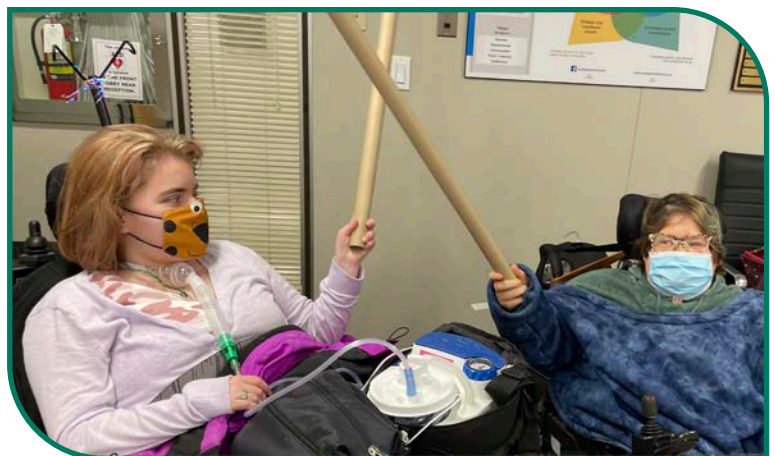
Amid a pandemic we managed to expand the overall capacity of our group supportive living programs in the community and launch the Sunbeam Kids Hub children's respite program.

Sunbeam is growing!

In just over a year we have gone from supporting 88 individuals across 18 group living locations, to now supporting approximately 110 persons of all ages across 25 group living locations in Waterloo Region, including St. Jacobs, Waterloo, Kitchener, Cambridge and Roseville. When you also consider the many individuals and families served by Sunbeam's overnight respite programs, our growth and reach has such a positive impact on the many communities we serve.

In the time that I have worked at Sunbeam, I have never witnessed such rapid expansion of our group living and respite programs. What makes this unique is that we were able to do this amid a global pandemic, when it seemed that many community opportunities were on hold, not expanding. In this second year of the COVID-19 pandemic, our staff teams continued to achieve Sunbeam's mission to provide innovative opportunities that enabled the people we support to reach their goals and achieve recognition of their value in the community.

Sunbeam has also undergone an evolution in its ability to serve individuals having a broad variety of needs, including providing clinical expertise for individuals having medically fragile / technologically dependent support needs, offering supports with activities of daily living and life enrichment activities for all individuals served, and offering the required expertise to help persons having more diverse and complex developmental and behavioural support needs to live their best lives.

Through our trusted collaboration with the Ministry of Children, Community & Social Services and other community partners, and with much innovation, Sunbeam continues to exceed the expectations of the community.

One great example of innovation is how the organization quickly pivoted early in the pandemic to provide virtual program support options to staff, individuals and families. Sunbeam's Management Information System (MIS) team was certainly up to the challenge, quickly providing hardware (laptops, tablets, headsets and more), software and connectivity to allow us to seamlessly continue providing programs and services during the most challenging of times. Staff at the Sunbeam Developmental Resource Centre (SDRC) and Developmental Services Ontario (DSO) Central West Region were able to continue their important work with families in the community through this virtual connectivity option. With the aid of virtual programming, the Sunbeam Community Outreach Program which regularly supported approximately 50 individuals pre-pandemic through scheduled programming, and up to 200 persons on community drop-in days, was able to further expand its reach through limited in-person programming for community members and building an incredibly broad client following across Central and South-West Ontario through its virtual, online programming.

As a member of the Compliance & Quality Assurance team at Sunbeam, I see everyday that growth means both new challenges and new opportunities. I am very excited to be part of the Sunbeam Community as it continues to broaden its reach and make such a positive difference in peoples' lives!

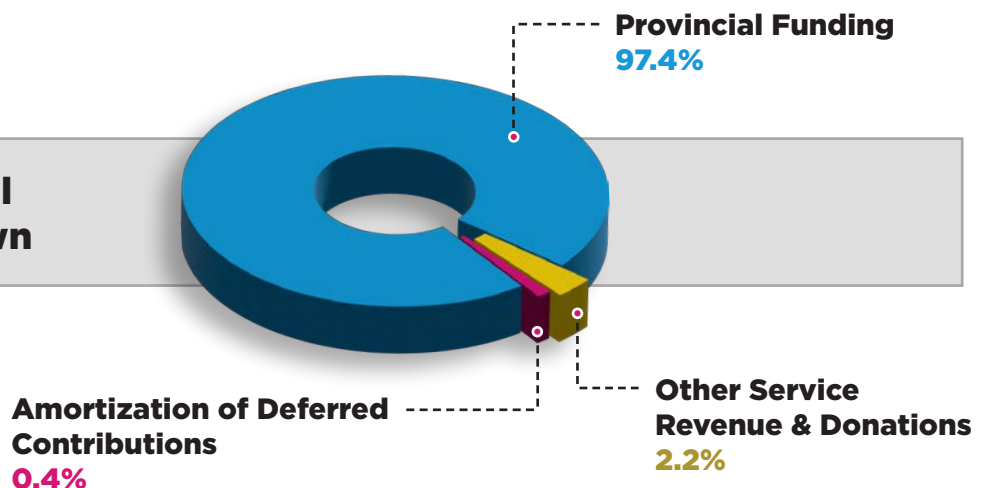

DSO has come a long way baby.....

In 2011, with only 3 of our 5 offices ready for opening, a limited provincial database, and everyone receiving assessor training throughout the province, the DSO's original staff of 15 launched what would become the version of the DSO that we now know and love.

The team has managed through thick and thin; windowless offices, self taught database usage, a desk shortage, and working from home before it was cool to become the well known and trusted community resource it is today.

Over the last 10 years, our small but mighty team has expanded to a staff complement of over 30 people housed in much better offices where we can benefit from the experiences, energy, and resources each individual brings. We now have a database of over 13,000 clients served, and we know that list will keep growing!

Our offices have changed, some people have come and gone but the DSO team has remained consistent in supporting one another for the good of the individual, the team, and the community that we serve. Teamwork has always been very important at DSO; even before Covid it was easy to feel isolated working across the region and even within our communities. But support, sharing of resources, gatherings of teams, potlucks, holiday parties and laughter got us through the last 10 years - we know these same things will help us as we develop into our next 10 years as well.

Sunbeam Seating and Mobility Clinic

Sunbeam's Seating and Mobility Clinic serves people with complex seating and positioning needs who are already recipients of support through Sunbeam Community and Developmental Services. The clinic also provides services to people within the larger community. We strive to find seating, positioning, and mobility equipment that will help the people we support function to the best of their abilities. We collaborate with local vendors to provide customized wheelchair seating systems, walkers, standers, and a variety of other items to facilitate safe and comfortable participation in daily activities. Our team consists of Sunbeam's Complex Care Coordinator, an Occupational Therapist who is also an Assistive Devices Program Authorizer, and local Seating and Mobility Sales Representatives and Technicians.

Sunbeam Specialized Dental Services



Since the start of the pandemic, both Sunbeam as well as the families we support were forced to make many adjustments to their lives. During this time, our dental clinic has gone through an extensive renovation which will make us better equipped to support the needs of individuals living with developmental disabilities and/or who are Medically Fragile/Technology Dependent (MFTD) - populations which historically have struggled to find access to specialized services that meet their complex needs.

All our staff are trained to meet the individual needs of the people we serve and adapt the service to the person and not the person to the service. Using a person-centered approach, the care and compassion demonstrated by our staff will ensure that those we serve are treated with the dignity they deserve when accessing any or all our specialized and fully accessible services.

COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics

First Dose Clinics in March/April, Second Dose Clinics in June/July, Booster Shots then followed

Sunbeam led the way to get shots in arms!

We wanted to send out a big thank you to everyone that helped us with making our “made-in-Waterloo Region” pop-up vaccination clinics possible. Through much hard work and careful planning, our community worked together to allow Sunbeam to run approximately 12 onsite vaccination clinics, delivering over 3,000 doses in a familiar, comfortable and supportive setting. From parking attendants, screeners, check-in, nurses, nursing students and administrators, all were crucial to the smooth operation of Sunbeam’s onsite clinics and we are so appreciative of the efforts of everyone involved!

Sunbeam also worked collaboratively with local and provincial partners to successfully advocate for prioritized access to vaccines for the people we serve as well as the caregivers (families and staff) who support them. We were so proud to offer the first dedicated clinics in the region providing vaccination doses to persons served and caregivers in the developmental services sector.

We couldn’t have done this without our many trusted partnerships - with the Region of Waterloo Public Health Unit and Ontario Health, with the Ministry of Children, Community & Social Services, and with our local partner organizations and many volunteers. The kind folks at Grand River Transit also stepped up to provided much needed transportation to and from our pop-up clinics so we could focus on supporting the people we serve through this new and unique experience. Well done to everyone involved!
