## **Important Reminders**

### MASKING

- In Sunbeam's Community Living Services programs, including group homes, respite, day program, recreation/wellness program, seating clinic, dental clinic masking of staff, volunteers and visitors is voluntary; HEPA filter units are also in use.
- All other Sunbeam locations are also considered mask-friendly.
- COVID RAPID TESTS
- Rapid testing for COVID-19 is available to staff, volunteers and clients at all locations
- **IPAC KEY REMINDERS**
- Sunbeam continues to regularly share refreshers and reminders with all staff about good infection prevention and control practices - in areas such as rapid testing, active screening, chain of transmission, hand hygiene, proper use of PPE, N95 masks, eye protection and more.

ACTIVE SCREENING FOR SYMPTOMS

 Monitoring your own health and wellness, and monitoring the health and well-being of the people we support for any possible COVID / Flu / Other Respiratory-like symptoms is critical to early identification of possible infection and transmission.

#### VACCINES AND BOOSTERS

 Flu vaccines and COVID boosters are currently available from family physicians, nurse practitioners, most walk-in clinics and local pharmacies.
